

CONFERENCE "EPISTEMOLOGY OF SPACE AND ITS QUALITIES"

28-29 January 2011 at ASRO, Leuven

The division of labour in the sciences has led to the compartmentalisation of knowledge about space and its qualities in different disciplinary fields with their associated concepts, methods and theoretical approaches. Accordingly, each discipline mobilises conceptions, perceptions and experiences of space and its qualities that often lead to misunderstandings and incomprehension. Moreover, we believe that it is crucial— and following Rapoport (1970)— to give meaning to the spatial quality concept by connecting it to the use of space, and the impact of human practices on and in space. As a possible way forward we propose a user-oriented multidimensional reading of space and its qualities.

The conference on the "Epistemology of Space and its Qualities" is part of an effort to build inter- and transdisciplinary platforms for the study of space, its uses and transformations. The central conference question focuses on "How different authors/agencies come to know, seek to shape, identify, and name various qualities and potentials of space?" To answer this question we will: (1) build on recent scientific developments, with focus on both theoretical and methodological aspects in strategic spatial planning, urban design, architecture and social innovation analysis; and (2) enter in dialogue with space users and user oriented perspectives.
