Greenbelts: Local Solutions for Global Challenges mixes panel discussions and site visits to Ontario's Greenbelt to highlight the potential of greenbelts to help manage urban growth, sustain farming and the vibrancy of surrounding communities, and protect valuable ecosystems. Delegates will learn from over forty-five speakers from across the globe.

Ontario's Greenbelt protects 1.8 million acres of prime farmland and green space around the Greater Golden Horseshoe. It provides clean water, healthy local food, and \$2.6 billion per year in ecological services. Over 90% of Ontarians agree that the Greenbelt is one of the most important contributions to the future of the Province, and 93% strongly support it.



Learn About

The Melbourne Green Wedges, forming a broad arc around metropolitan Melbourne, Australia, and part of a larger strategy to prevent urban sprawl into the hinterland.

The 'Iron Curtain' Green Belt, the belt of land spanning 1,393 kilometres along the noman's land on either side of the former 'Iron Curtain' in Germany, harbouring an incredible diversity of animal and plant species.

The European Greenbelt, an ecological network potentially connecting 24 countries in Europe from the North to the South.

The Sao Paulo City Green Belt Biosphere Reserve, with its world leading eco-training and entrepreneurship programs for disadvantaged youth.

The Frankfurt Green Belt, evolved from early green spaces where the medieval city walls once stood, to the 1991 'GrünGürtel' wrapping around the city, now forming part of a larger regional green system.

The Mazovia Region around Warsaw, where work is underway to establish a greenbelt to protect its unique environmental landscape, species habitat, and productive farmland.

The San Francisco Bay Area, with a comprehensive vision for smart growth and greenbelt protection.

The London Metropolitan Green Belt, the largest UK green belt, preventing urban sprawl and providing fresh food and open space.

The Dutch Green Heart, an agricultural area surrounded by The Hague, Amsterdam, Utrecht, and Rotterdam.

The Copenhagen Finger Plan, that has contributed to protecting agricultural and natural landscapes space since 1947.

The Ottawa National Capital Commission Greenbelt, the oldest and largest federally owned greenbelt in North America.

The British Columbia Agricultural Land Reserve, preserving farmland and strengthening farming across the province.

Dalton McGuinty is Ontario's 24th Premier. In the provincial election of 2003, he led the Liberal party to a majority government. He and his party earned a second consecutive majority on October 10, 2007. He has represented the riding of Ottawa South as its MPP since 1990.

Atwood has strong views on environmental issues, and she and her partner are the Joint Honourary Presidents of the Rare Bird Club within BirdLife International. She has been Chair of the Writers' Union of Canada and President of PEN Canada, and is currently a Vice President of PEN International.

He holds an Honours BA from the University of Western Ontario and MA and PhD from McGill University. - **Option 5:** Learn about improving access to locally grown food at two leading community food security organizations.








The Reel Greenbelt: Youth Video Competition
