International workshop in Tromsø, June 8, 2011

The workshop theme

Increasingly, local authorities are met with the double expectation of providing high-quality public services, and at the same time of promoting local economic and cultural development. And the citizens themselves are, by local elections, given the power to decide who should lead in local and regional policy-making.

Within this wide setting, the aim of the workshop is to discuss in what way, and to what extent, recent reforms are influencing democratic leadership and citizen participation. Are the reforms enabling or empowering local democracy with respect to novel planning tools, leadership and networking capacities? Are reforms at local and regional levels calibrated so as to enhance citizen participation – and can reforms lead to place promotion, to cultural and economic growth – to resonate with an output democracy perspective? We invite researchers and phd students to present perspectives as well as empirical findings related to recent reforms, to participate in the discussions, and to plan for future international cooperation on projects and publications.
