Aménagement et Urbanisme en France et en Grande-Bretagne réunit un ensemble d'études comparatives qui mettent en lumière les similitudes et les différences fondamentales entre la Grande-Bretagne et la France en matière d'aménagement et d'urbanisme. Tout en étant de proches voisins, ces deux pays ont développé des processus de planification spatiale très différents en termes de structure, de mise en œuvre et de philosophie sous-jacente.


Issu des travaux du Groupe d'études franco-britannique sur l'aménagement et l'urbanisme, et préfacé par Vincent Renard de l'Ecole Polytechnique, l'ouvrage propose une recherche comparative sur les contextes qui forment la base de l'aménagement dans les deux pays, incluant les implications administratives, économiques, financières et juridiques. Dans un deuxième temps, il se tourne vers l'illustration de plusieurs thèmes tels que la politique de la Ville, l'aménagement des transports à travers une analyse détaillée et des études de cas.

S'appuyant sur ces recherches le livre confronte les concepts de l'urbanisme dans une perspective à la fois nationale et européenne, s'attachant tout particulièrement à deux problèmes actuels : les effets de la croissance urbaine sur les petites villes et les villes-moyennes, et l'utilisation des partenariats publics-privés dans la réalisation des projets d'équipement.

Aménagement du territoire et Urbanisme en France et en Grande-Bretagne sera d'une valeur incomparable pour les décideurs et les praticiens des deux pays à une époque où les politiques nationales commencent à se tourner vers la pratique des autres pays.

Le livre est publié simultanément en anglais et en français, élargissant ainsi le débat entre les mondes anglophone et francophone.

Spatial Planning Systems of Britain and France brings together a wide selection of comparative essays to highlight the fundamental similarities and differences between the spatial planning in Great Britain and France: two countries that are near neighbours and yet have developed very different modes of planning in terms of their structure, practical application and underlying philosophies.

Drawing on the outcomes of the Franco-British Planning Study Group and with a foreword by Vincent Renard of the Ecole Polytechnique in Paris, the book offers a comparative investigation of the basic contexts for planning in both countries, including its administrative, economic, financial and legal implications, and then move on to illustrate themes such as urban policy and transport planning through detailed analysis and case studies.

From these investigations the book brings together planning concepts from both a national and European perspective, looking particularly at two current issues: the effects of urban growth on small market towns and the use of Public-Private partnerships to implement development projects.

Spatial Planning Systems of Britain and France will prove invaluable to policy makers and practitioners in both countries at a time when national policy is beginning to look towards practice in other countries.

The book is published simultaneously in English and French opening up a wider debate between the English-speaking and francophone worlds.
