Job Description

The Wageningen Land Use Planning group offers a challenging career path as an Assistant Professor in the field of spatial and environmental planning. As Assistant Professor you will develop an original and scientifically challenging research line and acquire funding for PhD's and postdocs, and supervise them to become a successful member of a research team. The new Assistant Professor will take a leading role in research and education on the spatial planning of landscapes in the interface between urban and rural land use systems. Your research will focus on communication, design and decision making of land use changes as a societal process based on the interdependency of social, ecological, and economic activities and the physical features of the landscape.
