Two Tenure Track Faculty Positions

The Department of City and Regional Planning at Cornell University invites applications for two tenure track faculty appointments to begin in August 2011. Cornell is a top-ranked planning department with 130 undergraduate majors (BS-Urban and Regional Studies), 120 professional master's students in accredited programs in City and Regional Planning and Historic Preservation Planning, and over 40 Ph.D. students in City and Regional Planning and Regional Science. The Department, with a full-time faculty of about 15, draws students from across the U.S. and the world and is one of the premier programs for international planning. The Department is in the College of Architecture, Art and Planning which is committed to advancing scholarship in the art and science of place-making and urban design by providing a supportive, resource-rich context for collaborative studies both within the unit and across the university.

We seek candidates who will enhance the diversity of the faculty and strengthen our efforts to integrate design, land use, historical preservation, social and economic policy planning in US and international settings to promote urban sustainability and equity. The successful candidates must demonstrate promise of high quality research (publishing and external grants), excellence in teaching and advising, as well as professional experience in the urban environment in the US and internationally. Candidates should have a Ph.D. or equivalent terminal degree in planning, regional science, geography, landscape architecture, architecture, or another relevant field. The appointments will be at the assistant professor rank.

Position #1 Urbanization, Community Development, and Project Management

We seek candidates with research and teaching expertise in urbanization, community development, and project management. Candidates who can conduct studio classes that address issues of place making and preservation, or large-scale urban development in the US and/or international settings are especially sought.

Position #2 Urban Infrastructure and Physical Design

We seek candidates with research and teaching expertise in transportation planning, urban infrastructure, physical design, urban finance and project planning. Candidates who have a broad interest in sustainability and urban development issues in both the U.S. and international settings are especially sought.

We are located in Ithaca, NY, on the main campus of Cornell University, a worldwide leader in international studies. Cornell seeks to train the next generation of scholars and practitioners who will carry forward a commitment to international knowledge, teaching, and service.
