

Bartlett Professor of Planning / Professor of Property and Planning (two full-time posts)

The Bartlett School of Planning at UCL is a research-led planning school with an international reputation offering innovative planning and built environment teaching programmes at both undergraduate and postgraduate levels. The School is now in a position to make a number of major new appointments the most senior of which are two new professorial appointments.

The first is the established Bartlett Professor of Planning, a chair previously held by such notables as Patrick Abercrombie, William Holford, Richard Llewelyn-Davies, Peter Hall, and Mike Batty. This post is open to all suitable candidates within the broad planning field regardless of specialisation.

The second is a newly established chair in Property and Planning, representing a desire to grow this aspect of the School and Faculty's research and teaching. We are seeking a candidate who can provide strong intellectual leadership in this vital field.

It is envisaged that the start date for these posts will be 1st September 2011 or as soon as possible after this date.

The successful candidates will be expected to contribute to developing the School's research profile through publication of a high international standard, and through attracting and undertaking funded research projects. They will also be expected to make a full contribution to the School's educational mission.

The appointment will be on the UCL professorial grade. The salary range will be negotiable on the professorial scale, but not less than £61,713 per annum.
